I realize that due to the many applications you may read through, I can't hold your attention long. Let me get to the gist of it. I think I can bring a unique perspective to the United States senate. You see I have lived through many of the problems facing our great nation today. Health care, I have been on both sides of the fence, I know what its like to have no insurance and I know what it is to have it. I have received the bloated hospital bills and I have seen how the insurance companies must deny and renegotiate them. I have seen where our doctors of old have delivered us and later

And how todays physicians (if you can get past a P.A. to the doctor) must refer us to a specialist. The system is broke due a lot to the Affordable Care Act.

I live in the immigration crisis. In Atkinson county over fifty percent (my observation of living in the community and attending school functions) of our residents are one-time migrants. Our little community has over a short amount time become like what I would imagine a Texas border town to look like. It seems we have more Hispanic businesses than American. But on the flip side I can see that these people are just taking advantage of the opportunity to better them selves and their family. Who could blame them? For the most part they are good people and other than what appears to be the breaking of immigration laws (that up until recently have not been enforced) They abide by the law. My children have grown up in school with them, played sports with them, we have attended church services with them, they have come to our church vacation bible school services and I have worked with them. God has opened my eyes to the fact we are all made in his image. And if we are honest, they provide an important work force for our farmers and industries. However open borders can not continue. With out borders we will cease to be a nation. The years of neglecting the Constitution has caught up with us. In my opinion we must create laws that will allow for legal immigration that include taxes on the applicants to offset cost of education and medical expenses. Also, a better form of vetting and a federal data base in order to keep record of the applicants. In 2011 we were struck by a driver who ran a stop sign: in all reality at least my wife and one of my children should have died. My wife and three of my children sustained injury. One of the occupant's in the other vehicle lost her life. The driver like my self-walked away. By Gods grace we were spared. A year later during an exit interview with the state patrol I was told the driver was an illegal alien and had fled the state, there was no way to track him down. This is real life.

I also know what is like to drive 50 miles to work. The best job I could obtain with my education is the one I currently have. I am currently a mechanic with C.S.X. transportation in Waycross. The jobs that have been lost to free trade are surely missed. I need only open my older sisters' yearbook to see an add from the Georgia pacific mill that once employed many people of Pearson. It like so many closed and left a community hanging. And even at C.S.X. I don't know how much longer I will have a job. Just last week thirty people were sent home. It seems the hedge fund that has taken over is not to interested in pulling freight but only cutting operating ratio in order to get stock prices up. The billions of dollars in profit is just not enough. By working here, I also have seen what the unions have become. I am currently a union objector. I still must be a member but at a reduced rate. It seems even though Georgia is a right to work state federal law requires railroad and aerospace employees to be union members. President Trump is right to put American jobs first.

I could go on and on Governor Kemp, but I will not keep you much longer. If you do for some miracle choose me know that I would represent the people of Georgia to the best of my abilities. Maybe one of the most important things time has taught me is that this is a great country. It was only by the grace of God it was formed and only by His grace will it continue. The Constitution was inspired by Him, it should be upheld. Next to the Bible I can think of no literature more important. If you have any follow up questions, please feel free to contact me.
