EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: On November 14, 2016, following several months of significant drought conditions, Executive Order 11.14.16.01 was issued banning the ignition of consumer fireworks throughout many areas of Georgia; and

WHEREAS: Since the issuance of Executive Order 11.14.16.01, much of the state has received rainfall amounts sufficient for the State Forestry Commission and the Georgia Department of Natural Resources to lift their bans on outdoor campfires; and

WHEREAS: The Insurance and Safety Fire Commissioner has determined that increased precipitation in recent weeks has diminished the threat posed by consumer fireworks and has requested the prohibition against the ignition of consumer fireworks be lifted.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That Executive Order 11.14.16.01 prohibiting the ignition of consumer fireworks is hereby rescinded.
