A PROCLAMATION
CHRONIC RECURRENT MULTIFOCAL
OSTEOMYELITIS DAY

WHEREAS: Chronic Recurrent Multifocal Osteomyelitis (CRMO) is a rare non-infectious inherited autoinflammatory disease that typically appears in children; and

WHEREAS: Those suffering with CRMO endure periodic severe bone pain, fevers, and multiple bone lesions. At least 25 children in Georgia suffer from CRMO; and

WHEREAS: The need for widespread awareness and understanding of CRMO is critical for meaningful research to continue and help improve the quality of life for those battling this disease; and

WHEREAS: We recognize CRMO Awareness Day and fundraisers will support organizations such as Kaila's Komforts, that support pediatric CRMO patients; now

THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim October 15, 2015 as CHRONIC RECURRENT MULTIFOCAL OSTEOMYELITIS DAY in Georgia.
