EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR STORM DAMAGE RENEWAL

WHEREAS: A severe storm system moved across the State of Georgia beginning

April 12, 2020 and continuing through the morning hours of April 13, 2020, producing tornadoes, straight line winds, and excessive

rainfall; and

WHEREAS: I signed Executive Order 04.13.20.01 declaring a State of Emergency;

and

WHEREAS: A severe storm system moved across the State of Georgia on April 23,

2020, producing tornadoes, straight line winds, and excessive

rainfall; and

WHEREAS: Executive Order 04.13.20.01 is set to expire on April 23, 2020, at

11:59 P.M.; and

WHEREAS: Code Section 38-3-51 vests the Governor with the authority to bring

emergency situations under control by issuing orders, rules, regulations to protect the safety and welfare of the public, and to

renew declarations of a state of emergency.

Now, therefore, pursuant to Code Section 38-3-51, and

THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF

GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

Order 04.13.20.01 is hereby renewed for fourteen

(14) days until May 7, 2020, at 11:59 P.M.

IT IS FURTHER

Ordered: That any orders derivative of or appurtenant to this Order addressing

this State of Emergency for Storm Damage shall not infringe,

overturn, or in any way amend any orders that have been issued for

the purpose of responding to the Public Health State of Emergency declared by Executive Order 03.14.20.01 and renewed by Executive Order 04.08.20.02.

All provisions of this Order shall become effective upon signature.
