## **ADDICTION RECOVERY AWARENESS** DAY

WHEREAS: Substance use disorders and mental illness affect millions of individuals of all

ages, races, and ethnic backgrounds as well as their families, friends, and

communities; and

WHEREAS: More than 25 million Americans, including 80,000 Georgians, are building lives

in recovery from substance use disorders and mental illness; and

WHEREAS: Recovery saves lives, restores families, strengthens communities, and builds a

stronger workforce, making Georgia a safer and healthier state; and

WHEREAS: The voice of the recovery community is the single most important voice in the

recovery process; and

WHEREAS: Mental health and substance use disorders recovery organizations across our

state continue to educate the public and policymakers on the need for access to

prevention, treatment, and peer-based recovery support services; and

WHEREAS: On Addiction Recovery Awareness Day and throughout the year, we recommit

ourselves to helping Georgians who are struggling to find the treatment they need, and we celebrate the individuals among us who have successfully

embarked on the road to recovery; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

January 28, 2020 as ADDICTION RECOVERY AWARENESS DAY in

Georgia.
