ALBANY-DOUGHERTY COUNTY DAY

Albany-Dougherty County is known for its innovative small businesses, growing tourism industry, world-class health care, a unique natural landscape, and endless educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS:

Albany-Dougherty County has suffered significant natural and economic impacts as a result of federally declared natural disasters that have occurred since 2017. Despite this, the community has displayed a unique resilience, rebuilding even strong than before; and

Since 1910, the Albany Area Chamber of Commerce has represented and advanced the interests of its citizens and business community with distinction, leading efforts to protect and enhance the quality of life and commercial vitality of the Albany area; and
