WHEREAS: On Forgiveness Day, organizations throughout Georgia are encouraged to open

their doors to the public and provide forgiveness activities and events that will

inspire attendees to exercise peacemaking and reconciliation; and

WHEREAS: By dedicating a day to edifying our citizens with peace and forgiveness

education, we can encourage all Georgians to live peacefully with their family

and friends; and

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

January 22, 2020 as FORGIVENESS DAY in Georgia.
