school, 33 million fewer girls than boys attend primary school, and 17 million

WHEREAS: Empowering and investing in girls is instrumental in promoting and protecting

the future of women. Statistics show that girls with an education earn higher

wages and support healthier, more prosperous families; and

WHEREAS: On Girls Empowerment Day, individuals and organizations in the State of

Georgia come together to celebrate and encourage young women to become the

leaders of tomorrow; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

February 20, 2020 as GIRLS EMPOWERMENT DAY in Georgia.
