A PROCLAMATION

RARE DISEASE DAY

WHEREAS: A rare disease is an ailment that affects fewer than 200,000 individuals. Nearly

7,000 diseases and conditions are considered rare in the United States, according

to the National Institutes of Health (NIH); and

WHEREAS: While each rare disease only affects a small number of people, they affect almost

30 million Americans altogether; and

Though more than 450 drugs and biologics have been approved for the WHEREAS:

treatment of rare diseases, millions of Americans are still left without treatment;

WHEREAS: Many rare diseases are serious, debilitating conditions that have a significant

impact on the lives of those affected; and

WHEREAS: Individuals and families affected by rare diseases often experience problems like

diagnosis delay, difficulty finding a medical expert, and lack of access to

treatments or ancillary services; and

WHEREAS: Nearly one in ten Americans have a rare disease, and thousands of Georgians

are among those affected; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

February 29, 2020 as RARE DISEASE DAY in Georgia.
