SOCIAL WORK MONTH

WHEREAS:

Social workers embody this year's Social Work Month theme, "Social Workers: Generations Strong" through their impact on every generation — from the Greatest Generation to Generation Z — in our governments, schools, universities, social service agencies, communities, the military, health care organizations, and mental health organizations; and

WHEREAS:

Social workers are dedicated to helping seniors and adults with disabilities live safer, healthier, and more independent lives; and

WHEREAS:

Social workers continue to improve children's prospects for a better future by working to expand foster care in areas where it is most needed, helping their parents provide financial and emotional support, and protecting them from abuse, neglect, and exploitation; and

WHEREAS:

School social workers in Georgia serve as vital members of the educational team, playing a central role in creating a positive environment in schools. They are especially skilled in identifying and providing services to students who face serious challenges, including poverty, disability, discrimination, abuse, addiction, bullying, loss of a loved one, and other barriers to learning and school success; and

Social workers in Georgia continue to bring individuals, communities, agencies, and governments together to help solve some of society's most pressing issues; now
