## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend an Act to provide for homestead exemptions from Hart County ad valorem taxes 2 for county purposes and from Hart County School District ad valorem taxes for educational 3 purposes for certain residents of that county and school district, approved April 6, 1992 4 (Ga. L. 1992, p. 5574), so as to increase the amount of such homestead exemption from Hart 5 County ad valorem taxes for county purposes from \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00 of the assessed value of that homestead; to provide for related matters; to provide for compliance with 6 constitutional requirements; to provide for applicability; to provide for a referendum, 7 8 contingent effective dates, and automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 9 purposes.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

## SECTION 1. An Act to provide for homestead exemptions from Hart County ad valorem taxes for county purposes and from Hart County School District ad valorem taxes for educational purposes for certain residents of that county and school district, approved April 6, 1992 (Ga. L. 1992, p. 5574), is amended by revising Section 2 as follows: "SECTION 2.

Each resident of Hart County who is 65 years of age or older is granted an exemption on that person's homestead from all Hart County ad valorem taxes for county purposes in the amount of \$15,000.00 of the assessed value of that homestead."

20	SECTION 2.
21	Said Act is further amended by revising Section 8 as follows:
22	"SECTION 8.
23	The exemption granted by Section 3 of this Act shall apply to all taxable years beginning
24	after December 31, 1992. The exemption granted by Section 2 of this Act shall apply to
25	all taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2021."
26	SECTION 3.
27	In accordance with the requirements of Article VII, Section II, Paragraph II(a)(1) of the
28	Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the
29	requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.
30	SECTION 4.
31	The election superintendent of Hart County shall call and conduct an election as provided in
32	this section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of Hart County for approval
33	or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that election on the date of the 2020
34	November general election and shall issue the call and conduct that election as provided by
35	general law. The election superintendent shall cause the date and purpose of the election to
36	be published once a week for two weeks immediately preceding the date thereof in the
37	official organ of Hart County. The ballot shall have written or printed thereon the words:
38	"() YES Shall the Act be approved which increases the homestead exemption from
39	() NO Hart County ad valorem taxes for county purposes from \$10,000.00 of the
40	assessed value of the homestead for residents of that county who are 65
41	years of age or older to \$15,000.00 of the assessed value?"
42	All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and all persons desiring
43	to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on
44	such question are for approval of the Act, Sections 1 and 2 of this Act shall become of full
45	force and effect on January 1, 2021, and shall apply to all taxable years beginning on or after
46	such date. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not conducted as provided in this
47	section, Sections 1 and 2 of this Act shall not become effective, and this Act shall be
48	automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election date.
49	The expense of such election shall be borne by Hart County. It shall be the election
50	superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.

## **SECTION 5.**

- 52 Except as otherwise provided in Section 4 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon
- 53 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

## 54 SECTION 6.

55 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
