# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 5C of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
alternative ad valorem taxes on motor vehicles, so as to revise the distribution of the proceeds
of such taxes among local governments; to provide for related matters; to provide an
effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

**SECTION 1.** 

Chapter 5C of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to alternative ad
valorem taxes on motor vehicles, is amended by revising paragraph (c)(3)(C) of Code
Section 48-5C-1, relating to definitions, exemption from taxation, allocation and
disbursement of proceeds collected by tag agents, fair market value of vehicle appealable,
and report, as follows:

12 ″(C) As to the proceeds remaining after the distribution provided for in 13 subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, with regard to the proceeds associated with and 14 collected on motor vehicle titles for motor vehicles registered in the incorporated areas 15 of the county, the tag agent of the county shall within 20 days following the end of each calendar month allocate such proceeds by the municipality from which the proceeds 16 17 were derived and then, for each such municipality, distribute  $\frac{28}{23}$  percent of such proceeds to the county governing authority and 23 28 percent of such proceeds to the 18 governing authority of such municipality, and the remaining 49 percent of such 19 proceeds shall be distributed to the board of education of the county school district; 20 21 provided, however, that, if there is an independent school district in such municipality, 22 then such 23 percent of such proceeds shall be distributed to the county governing authority and 34 percent of such proceeds shall be distributed to the governing authority 23 24 of such municipality and the remaining 49 43 percent of such proceeds shall be distributed to the board of education of the independent school district." 25

### **SECTION 2.**

- 27 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 28 without such approval.

## 29 **SECTION 3.**

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
