A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 14 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to other educational programs under the "Quality Basic Education Act,"
- 3 so as to authorize home study students and private school students to take courses at a college
- 4 and career academy; to provide for definitions; to provide for forms and procedures; to
- 5 provide for requirements; to provide for funding; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 6 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 8 SECTION 1.
- 9 Part 14 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 10 relating to other educational programs under the "Quality Basic Education Act," is amended
- 11 by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 12 "<u>20-2-319.5.</u>
- 13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 14 (1) 'College and career academy' has the same meaning as in Code Section 20-4-37.
- 15 (2) 'Course' means a course offered by a college and career academy to public school
- students enrolled in such college and career academy.
- 17 (3) 'Home study student' means a student in a home study program which meets the
- requirements of subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-690.
- 19 (4) 'Private school student' means a student in a private school which meets the
- 20 requirements of subsection (b) of Code Section 20-2-690.
- 21 (5) 'Resident school system' means the local school system in which a home study
- 22 <u>student or a private school student would be enrolled by virtue of his or her residence.</u>
- 23 (b) Local school systems are authorized to enroll home study students and private school
- 24 <u>students in one or more courses at a college and career academy which is geographically</u>
- 25 <u>located within the student's resident school system, so long as space is available in such</u>
- 26 course or courses.

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27 (c) The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and regulations to effectuate the

- 28 provisions of this Code section, which may include, but not limited to:
- 29 (1) Forms for use by local school systems to enroll a home study student or a private
- 30 <u>school student;</u>
- 31 (2) Timelines for enrolling and withdrawing from a course;
- 32 (3) Procedures for reporting academic progress and grades to the student's parent or
- guardian and the student's home study program or private school;
- 34 (4) Procedures for handling disciplinary issues that arise relating to home study students
- and private school students while attending the courses;
- 36 (5) Procedures for reporting disciplinary issues to the student's parent or guardian; and
- 37 (6) Any other procedures or requirements deemed necessary by the state board.
- 38 (d) Home study students and private school students enrolled in courses in college and
- 39 career academies pursuant to this Code section shall meet all of the same requirements for
- 40 <u>enrollment and participation in a course; shall be subject to all rules, including the school's</u>
- 41 code of conduct; and shall be subject to any fees for a course which are applicable to the
- 42 <u>public school students enrolled in the college and career academy.</u>
- 43 (e) Home study students and private school students shall be responsible for transportation
- 44 to and from the college and career academy.
- 45 (f) A local board of education shall earn FTE funds for each home study student and
- 46 private school student enrolled in one or more courses pursuant to this Code section at a
- 47 <u>college and career academy that has a charter with such local board of education. Such</u>
- 48 <u>funds shall be earned in accordance with Code Section 20-2-160 for any one-sixth segment</u>
- 49 of the day or its block scheduling equivalent that each such student attends in a manner
- 50 <u>similar to nonresident students, or in accordance with State Board of Education guidelines</u>
- 51 <u>established for such purpose</u>. A local board of education shall not charge home study
- 52 <u>students or private school students tuition to enroll in a course pursuant to this Code</u>
- 53 <u>section.</u>"

54 SECTION 2.

55 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
