EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

WHEREAS: On February 1, 2021, City of Nashville Mayor Taylor Scarbrough was indicted on one count of Theft of Services, one count of Theft by Conversion, one count of Theft by Deception, and one count of Criminal Damage to Property in the Second Degree; and

WHEREAS: The indictment was transmitted to the Governor pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 45-5-6(b), and the certified copy was received on February 8, 2021; and

WHEREAS: An Executive Order was issued on March 3, 2021, appointing members to the Review Commission to determine whether the indictment relates to and adversely affects the administration of the office of Mayor of the City of Nashville such that the rights and interests of the public are adversely affected; and

WHEREAS: By the report dated March 16, 2021, the Review Commission found that the indictment of Taylor Scarbrough does relate to and does adversely affect the administration of the office of Mayor, and that the rights and interests of the public are adversely affected thereby; and recommended that Taylor Scarbrough be suspended from office pursuant to the provisions of O.C.G.A. § 45-5-6.

NOW, THEREFORE, PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME AS GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA, IT IS HEREBY

ORDERED: That Mr. Taylor Scarbrough is hereby suspended from office immediately and without further action pending the final disposition of the case or until the expiration of his term of office, whichever occurs first, as provided in 45-5-6(c).
