A PROCLAMATION

ALPHA-1 ANTITRYPSIN DEFICIENCY (ALPHA-1) AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:

Alpha-1 Antitrypsin Deficiency (Alpha-1) is a hereditary disorder that can result in life threatening lung disease in adults and liver disease in both children and

adults; and

WHEREAS:

Alpha-1 has been identified in nearly all populations and ethnic groups, and it is estimated that about 1 in every 2,500 Americans have Alpha-1 and up to 6 percent of Caucasians in the U.S. carry a single deficient gene and may pass the

gene on to their children; and

WHEREAS:

Alpha-1 is widely under and misdiagnosed, with fewer than 10 percent of those predicted to have Alpha-1 have been diagnosed. It often takes an average of five doctors and seven years from the time symptoms appear before proper

diagnosis is made, which can be done using a simple blood test; and

WHEREAS:

It is important to increase awareness and detection of this serious hereditary and

misdiagnosed disorder; and

WHEREAS:

During the month of November, a nationwide awareness campaign will take place throughout the country to educate the public as well as the medical community on Alpha-1 detection and treatment for those affected by this

condition; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim November 2021 as ALPHA-1 AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
