- WHEREAS:** Energy-related industries provide careers to tens of thousands of Georgians, ranging from line workers to natural gas technicians, customer service representatives to engineers, chemists to environmentalists, power plant operators to executives – all valued and all essential; and
- WHEREAS:** Energy-related industries need a diverse workforce to provide a bridge into the future, replacing retiring workers and maintaining a highly skilled and talented workforce to meet the new challenges of a growing economy through partnerships; and
