Case managers are recognized experts and vital participants in the care coordination team who empower people to understand and access quality, efficient health care; and

WHEREAS:

Case Managers Week serves to educate the public about case management and increase recognition of the significant contributions of case managers to quality health care for patients, heath care providers, and payers; and

WHEREAS:

Thousands of Georgians have benefited from the dedication and compassionate care they received from case managers. Our state is proud to commend the men and women who are committed to improving the health and well-being of our citizens; and

WHEREAS:

Facilities ranging from hospitals, insurance companies, rehabilitation facilities, home health agencies, and managed care organizations will sponsor local educational events to commemorate Case Managers Week; now
