A PROCLAMATION

COGENITAL DIAPHRAGMATIC HERNIA AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: Congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH) occurs when the diaphragm, the muscle that

separates the chest from the abdomen, fails to close during prenatal development. This opening allows contents of the abdomen to migrate into the chest cavity, preventing

the growth and development of the lungs; and

WHEREAS: CDH is one of the most common major congenital anomalies, occurring in

approximately one in 2,500 births, with over 1,600 babies diagnosed each year in the

United States alone; and

WHEREAS: There is currently no known cause of CDH, but studies have suggested that it is likely

due to a number of genetic and environmental factors; and

WHEREAS: Those with CDH often endure multiple surgeries and possible medical complications,

which can include heart defects, pulmonary complications, gastric and intestinal

problems, and developmental delays; and

WHEREAS: Raising awareness of CDH will help bring about acceptance and support for those who

suffer from this birth defect and further promote much-needed research and medical

advances; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 2021

as CONGENITAL DIAPHRAGMATIC HERNIA AWARENESS MONTH in

Georgia.
