WHEREAS: Hundreds of thousands of Americans suffer from unpreventable and costly chronic and rare

conditions, including the deadliest and costliest chronic diseases such as cardiovascular, stroke,

diabetes, cancer, and obesity, which are also the most preventable; and

WHEREAS: Chronic Disease Day promotes actionable resources to reduce individual risk and lower the rate of

chronic disease throughout Georgia and our nation; and

WHEREAS: Chronic Disease Day is supported by advocacy organizations dedicated to assisting patients overcome

challenges with access to care throughout Georgia and across the United States; and

WHEREAS: Raising public awareness of these diseases will continue to facilitate the discovery of treatments and

cures, as well as bringing much needed funding for support and services for those affected by muscular

and neuromuscular diseases; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim July 10th, 2021 as

CHRONIC DISEASE DAY in Georgia.
