APROCLAMATION

CONSTITUTION WEEK

WHEREAS: The Constitution of the United States of America, the guardian of our liberties, embodies the

principles of limited government in a Republic dedicated to the rule by law; and

WHEREAS: On September 17, 2021 and the week following, we celebrate the 234th Anniversary of the 1787

Constitutional Convention; and at this convention, the world's oldest written constitution was drafted by the United States, thus outlining the fundamental principles by which our nation is governed; and

WHEREAS: Our Constitution established six basic governing principles for society. These include popular

sovereignty, the rule of law, federalism, judicial review, individual rights, and separation of powers

through a system of checks and balances; and

WHEREAS: The Constitution ensures the distribution of functions and responsibilities among three separate

branches and a system of checks and balances to calibrate those powers, ultimately ensuring the

protection of individual rights and liberties; and

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia was the fourth state in the Union to ratify the Constitution; and Georgia

Delegates Abraham Baldwin and William Few signed the document on Jan 2, 1788; and

WHEREAS: Public Law 915 guarantees the issuing of a proclamation each year by the President of the United

States of America designating September 7th through 23rd as Constitution Week; and

WHEREAS: Constitution Week provides an opportunity for all citizens to learn of Georgia's historic role during

our nation's founding; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 17-23, 2021,

as CONSTITUTION WEEK and September 17, 2021 as CONSTITUTION DAY in Georgia.
