DYSLEXIA DAY AT THE CAPITOL

- WHEREAS:** Dyslexia is a learning disorder that affects the brain's ability to process language, causing difficulty in reading, spelling, and writing; and
- WHEREAS:** An estimated 15 to 20 percent of Americans are affected by Dyslexia; and
- WHEREAS:** With proper diagnosis, appropriate instruction, and support from families, teachers, and friends, individuals with dyslexia can excel in school and in the workforce; and
- WHEREAS:** The Schenck School, founded in 1959 by David Schenck, has been remediating people with dyslexia for over 60 years; and
- WHEREAS:** The mission of The Schenck School is to build a solid educational foundation for students with dyslexia and develop their rich potential; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February 23, 2021, as DYSLEXIA DAY at the State Capitol in Georgia.
