WHEREAS: An estimated 15 to 20 percent of Americans are affected by Dyslexia; and

WHEREAS: With proper diagnosis, appropriate instruction, and support from families,

teachers, and friends, individuals with dyslexia can excel in school and in the

workforce; and

WHEREAS: The Schenck School, founded in 1959 by David Schenck, has been remediating

people with dyslexia for over 60 years; and

WHEREAS: The mission of The Schenck School is to build a solid educational foundation

for students with dyslexia and develop their rich potential; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

February 23, 2021, as DYSLEXIA DAY at the State Capitol in Georgia.
