A PROCLAMATION

EYE DONATION MONTH

WHEREAS:	Sight is one of our most powerful senses, and many Georgians should recognize it is within their power to give someone else the ability to see; and
WHEREAS:	The purpose of Eye Donation Month is to alert Georgians to the power and opportunity they possess to give the gift of sight; and
WHEREAS:	Eye donation for research has the potential to restore sight to those suffering certain types of blindness, and over 50,000 Georgians have received the gift of sight from an eye donor; and
WHEREAS:	Eye donation can give comfort and a sense of purpose to grieving families. Eye donation for corneal transplantation restores useful vision to those suffering from corneal blindness, and approximately 1,600 sight-restoring cornea transplants are performed every year in Georgia; and
WHEREAS:	Eye donation is one of the most selfless gifts we can provide to our fellow citizens, and it is vitally important to discuss with our loved ones and family our desire and decision to donate; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim November 2021 as EYE DONATION MONTH in Georgia.
