WHEREAS: Many Laotian Americans were forced to leave their homeland in fear of

communist government because many have fought alongside the United States;

and

WHEREAS: Laotian Americans escaped from their home which were filled with cluster

bombs that were designed as anti-personnel, anti-armor weapons, but the

primary victims have been innocent civilians; and

WHEREAS: The bombings destroyed many villages and displaced hundreds of thousands of

Lao civilians. Many people were burdened with unexploded ordnance (UXO)

contamination; and

WHEREAS: Laotian Americans make great contributions to our economy, culture, and

quality of life; and

WHEREAS: Laotian Americans contribute positively to the social, educational, political,

civic, culture, and economic well-being of our state with hundreds of businesses

and community organizations in the region; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

May 2021, as LAO HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.
