LIFE SCIENCES WEEK

WHEREAS:

Georgia is a center of global health innovation and home to the United States Centers of Disease Control and Prevention, Carter Center, Task Force for Global Health, CARE International, American Cancer Society, Arthritis Foundation, American Red Cross, and world-renowned research universities; and

WHEREAS:

The life sciences industry encompasses any initiative aimed at improving the quality and standard of life from industry sectors, including biotechnology, medical devices, diagnostics, pharmaceuticals, digital health, research institutes, global health, bio-agriculture and biofuels, contract manufacturing organizations, and clinical research organizations; and

The life sciences industry in Georgia is resilient and growing with over 1,960 unique establishments that contribute more than 68,300 direct jobs and \$10 billion to Georgia's gross domestic product; and
