The rate of unintentional injuries and deaths in the United States remains at

unacceptable levels; and

WHEREAS:

Risk identification, pandemic-related safety concerns, psychological safety, and

advancing organizational safety remain critical to preventing injuries and deaths

in the United States; and

WHEREAS:

Georgia residents and all Americans deserve to live in communities that

promote safe and healthy living; and

WHEREAS:

Preventing unintentional injuries and deaths requires cooperation of all levels of

government, employers, and the general public; and

WHEREAS:

The National Safety Council Southeastern Chapter works to promote policies, practices, and procedures leading to increased safety, protection and health in business and industry, in schools and colleges, on roads and highways, and in

homes and communities; and

WHEREAS:

The summer season is a time of increased rates of unintentional injuries and

death, it is an appropriate time to focus attention on injury risks and prevention;
