A PROCLAMATION

RONALD REAGAN DAY

- WHEREAS:** President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background, worked throughout his life serving freedom and advancing the public good, having been employed as an entertainer, union leader, corporate spokesman, Governor of California, and President of the United States; and
- WHEREAS:** President Reagan served with honor and distinction for two terms at the 40th President of the United States of America, the second of which he was victorious in forty-nine of fifty states in the general election – a feat unsurpassed in the history of American presidential elections; and
- WHEREAS:** In 1981, when Ronald Reagan was inaugurated as President, he inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant inflation and high unemployment; and
- WHEREAS:** President Reagan's strong belief in the power of the individual allowed his administration to revitalize the economy in one of the longest economic expansions in American history; and
- WHEREAS:** Through his leadership, President Reagan exhibited a commitment to our Armed Forces that contributed to the restoration of pride in America, preparing America's Armed Forces to meet the challenges of the 21st century; and
- WHEREAS:** President Reagan's vision of peace through strength led to the end of the Cold War and the ultimate demise of the Soviet Union, guaranteeing basic human rights for millions of people; and
- WHEREAS:** February 6, 2021 will mark the 110th anniversary of President Reagan's birth and the seventeenth since his passing; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim February 6, 2021 as RONALD REAGAN DAY in Georgia.
