A PROCLAMATION

SPINAL CORD INJURY AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:

A spinal cord injury is an injury to an individual's spinal cord resulting in temporary or permanent changes in the spinal cord's normal motor, sensory, or

autonomic function; and

WHEREAS:

Those who sustain spinal cord injuries often face permanent and profound neurologic deficits and accompanying paralysis; and

WHEREAS:

These injuries often result from car accidents, but they can also occur due to falls, acts of violence, sports injuries, and non-traumatic injuries such as a spinal disease. Regardless of the cause, spinal cord injuries can alter an individual's life forever; and

WHEREAS:

Currently, approximately 285,000 Americans are living with spinal cord injuries and roughly 17,500 new cases of spinal cord injuries occur each year. Each case is unique and affects each person's life in different ways; and

WHEREAS:

In September 2014, U.S. Senate Resolution 533 established September as National Spinal Cord Injury Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS:

Spinal Cord Injury Awareness Month provides opportunities for numerous organizations, including the United Spinal Association's Atlanta Chapter, to generate greater awareness regarding the injury, educate the community at large, and promote research efforts to help those affected regain mobility; now

THEREFORE:

I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim September 2021 as SPINAL CORD INJURY AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
