A PROCLAMATION

SUDDEN UNEXPLAINED DEATH IN CHLDHOOD AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood (SUDC) is a category of death in

children between the ages of one and eighteen that remains unexplained even

after a thorough investigation and autopsy; and

WHEREAS: Each year, there are approximately 400 cases of SUDC in the United States, and

among children ages one to four, SUDC is the fifth leading cause of death; and

WHEREAS: There is currently no way to predict or prevent SUDC as its cause is unknown.

It is hoped that future research will identify means by which SUDC can be

prevented; and

WHEREAS: We recognize the dedicated efforts of organizations, such as the SUDC

Foundation, medical professionals, and medico logical death investigators who

are working to better understand the causes of SUDC; and

WHEREAS: Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood Awareness Month provides an

opportunity to honor the memory of the young lives that ended too soon, show support for the families devastated by their loss, and increase public awareness

of SUDC and the ongoing search for answers; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

March 2021 as SUDDEN UNEXPLAINED DEATH IN CHILDHOOD

AWARNESS MONTH in Georgia.
