diversity; and

The Georgia Telugu-speaking community has been contributing to the state in

the fields of medical and engineering research, politics, legal, language, culture,

and tradition, along with economic welfare; and

The Georgia Telugu community celebrate their rich culture and heritage

throughout Telugu Language and Heritage Month with various literacy programs such as Telugu language reading, singing, writing, poetry, and speech
