WHEREAS: In 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued a proclamation declaring the week of March

8th as "National Women's History Week." Six years after his proclamation,

Congress declared March of each year to be "Women's History Month"; and

WHEREAS: March 8th marks International Women's Day on which women are recognized for

> their achievements. International Women's Day first emerged from the activities of labor movements, and the first National Women's Day was observed in the United

States on February 28, 1909; and

WHEREAS: All Georgians are encouraged to recognize the women who have left their mark on

the history of our state, as well as those whose leadership will continue to ensure

our best days lie ahead; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim March

2021 as WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH in Georgia.
