# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and
 businesses, so as to amend a provision relating to fingerprint and criminal background checks
 for licensure of physicians, physician assistants, and others; to amend a provision relating to
 fingerprint and criminal background checks for licensure of podiatrists; to provide for related
 matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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## **SECTION 1.**

8 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,
9 is amended in Code Section 43-34-13, relating to fingerprinting and criminal background
10 checks for health care professionals licensed by the Georgia Composite Medical Board, by
11 revising subsection (b) as follows:

12 "(b) Any applicant as a health care professional or as an expedited physician licensee shall 13 have satisfactory results from a fingerprint records check report conducted by the Georgia 14 Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the 15 board. Application for a license, certificate, or permit under this chapter shall constitute 16 express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform a criminal 21

background check. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for licensure,
certification, or permit agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary
to run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of
fingerprints. The applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the performance
of such criminal background check."

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## **SECTION 2.**

23 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 43-35-12.1, relating to fingerprint and
24 criminal background checks, as follows:

25 "43-35-12.1.

26 Any applicant for a license or renewal reinstatement shall have satisfactory results from a 27 fingerprint records check report conducted by the Georgia Crime Information Center and 28 the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the board. Application for a license 29 or reinstatement under this chapter shall constitute express consent and authorization for 30 the board or its representative to perform a criminal background check. Each applicant 31 who submits an application to the board for licensure or reinstatement agrees to provide the 32 board with any and all information necessary to run a criminal background check, 33 including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of fingerprints. The applicant shall be 34 responsible for all fees associated with the performance of such criminal background check." 35

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## **SECTION 3.**

37 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law38 without such approval.

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## **SECTION 4.**

40 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
