

House Bill 396 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To repeal an Act creating the South Georgia Regional Information Technology Authority,  
2 approved May 29, 2007 (Ga. L. 2007, p. 4336), as amended; to provide for assets and  
3 liabilities thereof; to provide for related matters; to provide for effective dates; to repeal  
4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 An Act creating the South Georgia Regional Information Technology Authority, approved  
8 May 29, 2007 (Ga. L. 2007, p. 4336), as amended, is hereby repealed in its entirety.

9 **SECTION 2.**

10 (a) By June 30, 2021, the South Georgia Regional Information Technology Authority shall  
11 distribute any remaining assets equally among Baker, Calhoun, Early, Miller, Mitchell, and  
12 Terrell counties.

13 (b) There are no known obligations of the South Georgia Regional Information Technology  
14 Authority, but to the extent such obligations exist, they shall be transferred to and assumed  
15 equally among Baker, Calhoun, Early, Miller, Mitchell, and Terrell counties, by such

16 instruments as may be required to maintain the same. The governing authorities of Baker,  
17 Calhoun, Early, Miller, Mitchell, and Terrell counties are authorized to act jointly and  
18 severely and execute any such instruments required to transfer such obligations into the  
19 names of such counties and are authorized to do so in the name of the South Georgia  
20 Regional Information Technology Authority.

21 **SECTION 3.**

22 (a) Section 1 of this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2021.

23 (b) Except as provided for in subsection (a) of this section, this Act shall become effective  
24 upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.

25 **SECTION 4.**

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
