A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to offenses against public order, so as to revise the offense of wearing a mask, hood,
- 3 or device which conceals the identity of the wearer; to clarify application; to provide for
- 4 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 8 offenses against public order, is amended by revising Code Section 16-11-38, relating to
