A PROCLAMATION

CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS WEEK

WHEREAS: Children's mental health is the heart of wellness in Georgia communities,

especially since the COVID-19 pandemic has caused increased stress for

children, adolescents, and their families; and

WHEREAS: One in ten children in Georgia suffer from serious emotional and mental

disorders that, when left untreated, cause significant functional impairment in

their day-to-day lives at home, in school, and with peers; and

WHEREAS: Most children and adolescents with mental disorders do not receive treatment,

leaving them at increased risk of school drop-out, involvement in the Juvenile

Justice system, and negative life outcomes; and

WHEREAS: With early identification and appropriate treatment, children of all ages can

obtain resiliency building services, support, and treatment, and go on to live

productive and satisfying lives; and

WHEREAS: Georgia's APEX program, funded by the Georgia Department of Behavioral

Health and Developmental Disabilities, continues to expand in school-based settings to provide mental health wellness strategies, early intervention, and

appropriate and timely treatment when symptoms develop; and

WHEREAS: Children's mental health awareness is vital to ensuring that Georgia's children

and communities learn about the warning signs of mental health disorders and

how to get the help they need; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

May 1 - 7, 2022 as CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS WEEK

in Georgia.
