A PROCLAMATION

CHRONIC DISEASE DAY

accounts for 7 of the top 10 causes of premature death in Americans

throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS: Hundreds of thousands of Americans suffer from unpreventable and costly

chronic and rare conditions, as well as the deadliest and costliest chronic diseases, including cardiovascular, stroke, diabetes, cancer, and obesity; and

WHEREAS: Chronic Disease Day promotes actionable resources to reduce individual risk

and lower the rate of chronic disease across Georgia and our nation; and

WHEREAS: Raising public awareness of these diseases will continue to facilitate the

10, 2022, as CHRONIC DISEASE DAY in Georgia.
