CRI DU CHAT SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS: Each year in the United States alone, approximately 50 to 60 children are born

with 5p- Syndrome (five p minus), also known as Cat Cry Syndrome or Cri du

Chat Syndrome; and

WHEREAS: Some common characteristics of Cri du Chat Syndrome at birth are a high-

> pitched cry, low birth weight, poor muscle tone, microcephaly, and potential medical complications. "5p-" is a term used by geneticists to describe a portion

of chromosome number five that is missing in these individuals; and

WHEREAS: Children born with this rare genetic defect will most likely require ongoing

> support from a team of parents, therapists, and medical and educational professionals to help the child achieve his or her maximum potential; and
