## **A PROCLAMATION**

## CYBERBULLYING PREVENTION AND AWARENESS WEEK

WHEREAS: Cyberbullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior that can occur through SMS, Text,

and apps, or online in social media that is used to share content; and

WHEREAS: Cyberbullying can take place in any situation at any time with the use of the internet to

share hateful and hurtful messages. These conditions can lead to anxiety, depression,

and even suicide in youth; and

WHEREAS: Bullying affects one in three youth, but unfortunately only one in ten teens tell an adult

if they have been a victim of cyberbullying. Once harmful materials are circulated on the Internet, they may never disappear, resurfacing at later times to renew the pain of cyberbullying. Some cyberbullying cases may cross the line into unlawful or criminal

behavior; and

WHEREAS: Children and teens who are victims of cyberbullying may avoid technological devices,

withdraw from family and friends, and experience a decline in academic performance. Victims may also appear reluctant to attend school or social events and have poor eating

or sleeping habits; and

WHEREAS: Many youths do not know how to deal with bullies who hide behind their screen, unsure

of who to talk to or how to report incidents; and

WHEREAS: During Cyberbullying Prevention & Awareness Week, students, teachers, parents, and

community members are encouraged to bring awareness and offer solutions to cyberbullying, and work to create a safe environment for all Georgia's children to live,

learn, and grow; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 24

- 29, 2022 as CYBERBULLYING PREVENTION AND AWARENESS WEEK in

Georgia.
