A PROCLAMATION

CYSTINURIA AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS: Cystinuria is a chronic genetic condition characterized by excessive cystine in

the urine, leading to the formation of cystine stones in the kidney, ureter, and

bladder; and

WHEREAS: Thousands of Americans are affected by cystinuria, with the majority of patients

presenting with symptomatic stones before the age of 30; and

WHEREAS: Cystinuria patients often endure episodes of debilitating pain (called renal colic),

nausea, vomiting, and recurrent urinary tract infections, and typically require numerous surgical interventions for stone removal which can cause physical,

emotional, and financial strain on patients and their families; and

WHEREAS: Affected individuals may suffer from potentially serious medical complications

such as hypertension, renal insufficiency, and, rarely, kidney failure; and

WHEREAS: Studies have demonstrated that individuals with cystinuria have a lower health-

related quality of life than the general population, specifically in areas of general

health, bodily pain, and mental health; and

WHEREAS: Although there is no cure for cystinuria, early diagnosis and management with

dietary measures and medications can help prevent stone formation and limit

long-term kidney damage; and

WHEREAS: Cystinuria Awareness Day seeks to raise awareness of cystinuria and the

importance of early diagnosis and management, and recognize the need for support to those who have this disease and research to improve screening and

treatments; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

June 24, 2022 as CYSTINURIA AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
