A PROCLAMATION

DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: More than 700 injury crashes involve distracted driving on an average day, and

the economic toll of all motor vehicle crashes in the United States annually

exceeds \$400 billion; and

WHEREAS: Talking on a mobile phone, even in hands-free mode, texting, or programming

your dashboard infotainment system or GPS device, can divert one's attention

away from driving and result in physical or cognitive distraction; and

WHEREAS: Preventing distracted driving injuries and deaths requires the cooperation of all

levels of government, employers, and the general public; and

WHEREAS: The National Safety Council Southeastern Chapter works to promote policies,

> practices and procedures leading to increased safety, protection and health in business and industry, in schools and colleges, on roads and highways, and in homes and communities, and is working all month long to educate the public

about distracted driving; and

WHEREAS: Spring is a time when people begin to log more miles on the road, and it is

imperative to focus attention on motor vehicle injury risks and preventions; now

WHEREAS: During Distracted Driving Awareness Month, Georgians are encouraged to

practice safe driving behaviors and pledge to drive distraction-free; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

April 2022 as DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
