A PROCLAMATION

GASTROSCHISIS AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS: 1 in 2229 individuals are born with gastroschisis in the United States, and

roughly the same number born in Georgia annually. While the disease itself may affect small numbers of people, its impact affects many more; and

WHEREAS: Those affected by gastroschisis can have serious and debilitating conditions that

significantly impact their lives, including, but not limited, to slow growth, short

bowel syndrome, multiple organ transplants, and long-term feeding issues; and

WHEREAS: Individuals and families affected by gastroschisis often experience problems

such as a sense of isolation, difficulty in obtaining an accurate and timely diagnosis, limited treatment options, and problems related to accessing or being

reimbursed for treatment; and

WHEREAS: The cause of gastroschisis is relatively unknown, and patients and their families

must bear a large share of the burden for things such as raising funds for

research; and

WHEREAS: Avery's Angels Gastroschisis Foundation (AAGF) is an organization founded

on the initial cause of providing support to families, funding the needs of the cause above all else, and encouraging research to discover the causes and

promote prevention; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim July

30, 2022, as GASTROSCHISIS AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 28th day of June in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Two.
