A PROCLAMATION

LAO HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS: The United States recognized the Kingdom of Laos in 1950; and

WHEREAS: Many Laotian Americans who courageously fought against Communism were forced to leave their homeland for fear of

retribution from their government; and

WHEREAS: Georgia became home to a significant number of Laotian

Americans, many of whom were provided political asylum and citizenship because of their important contributions to American

interests; and

WHEREAS: The Lao community of Georgia is a valued part of our state's diverse

population, and the rich heritage, culture, tradition, and language of Laotian Americans have provided positive social, educational, and

economic growth to Georgia; and

WHEREAS: April is Lao New Year and is celebrated throughout the world and

in Georgia by those of Lao heritage; and

WHEREAS: Laotian Americans contribute positively to the social, educational,

political, civic, cultural, and economic well-being of our state with hundreds of business and community organizations in the region;

now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby

proclaim April 2022 as LAO HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.

and Twenty-Two.
