A PROCLAMATION

PURPLE DAY – EPILEPSY AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS: Purple Day is celebrated every March 26th in recognition of Epilepsy

Awareness Day; and

WHEREAS: There are more than 40 different forms of epilepsy, as well as 25

different types of seizures; and

WHEREAS: Approximately 3 million Americans and 65 million people

worldwide suffer from a form of epilepsy; and

WHEREAS: Not all forms of epilepsy are treatable, but those that are require a

combination of drug therapy and sometimes surgery; and

WHEREAS: If someone is having a seizure, the best thing for you to do is stay

with them, time the seizure, and keep them safe. Call 911 if the

seizure last longer than five minutes; and

WHEREAS: Purple Day is a grassroots effort celebrated on all continents in over

a dozen countries to spread awareness of the neurological condition;

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby

proclaim March 26, 2022 as PURPLE DAY in Georgia.
