A PROCLAMATION

SCOLIOSIS AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: Scoliosis is a condition that can affect a member of any gender, race, age, or

socioeconomic status. It is an abnormal curvature of the spine that has no known cause and affects over seven million people nationwide, or 2 to 3

percent of the population; and

WHEREAS: Public awareness of scoliosis is an important component of helping children,

parents, adults, and health care providers understand, recognize, and treat the

complexities of spinal deformities; and

WHEREAS: An estimated one million scoliosis patients utilize health care resources annually,

with approximately one out of every six children being diagnosed with this

condition eventually requiring active medical treatment; and

WHEREAS: The primary age of onset for scoliosis is between ten and 15 years old, with

females being five times more likely to progress to a curve magnitude that

requires treatment; and

WHEREAS: Screening programs, such as the ones conducted through public schools, allow

for early detection and treatment opportunities that may alleviate the worst

effects of the condition; and

WHEREAS: Georgians are encouraged to observe Scoliosis Awareness Month by renewing

our commitment to raise awareness of the spinal condition and recognize the need for increased research and funding that may one day further alleviate the

suffering of the millions affected by this condition; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

June 2022 as SCOLIOSIS AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
