A PROCLAMATION

SECOND CHANCE MONTH

WHEREAS: Redemption and second chances are American values because all people are

endowed with human dignity and value; and

WHEREAS: Approximately 70 million Americans have a criminal record, with more than

40,000 individuals incarcerated in state prisons across Georgia; and

WHEREAS: The Council of State Governments reports that the number of legal collateral

consequences of a criminal conviction exceeds 44,000, including 1,006 specific

to Georgia; and

WHEREAS: These barriers can contribute to recidivism, which increases victimization and

decreases public safety; and

WHEREAS: The designation of April as Second Chance Month contributes to increased

> public awareness about the need for closure for those who have paid their debt and opportunities for individuals, employers, congregations, and communities

to extend second chances; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

April 2022 as SECOND CHANCE MONTH in Georgia.
