A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To provide a homestead exemption from Bartow County school district ad valorem taxes for 2 educational purposes in the amount of \$60,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for 3 residents of that school district who are 65 years of age or older, in the amount of \$80,000.00 4 of the assessed value of the homestead for residents of that school district who are 75 years 5 of age or older, and in the amount of the full assessed value of the homestead for residents of that school district who are 80 years of age or older; to provide for definitions; to specify 6 7 the terms and conditions of the exemption and the procedures relating thereto; to provide for 8 applicability; to provide for a referendum, effective dates, and automatic repeal; to provide 9 for compliance with constitutional requirements; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other 10 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

13 (a) As used in this Act, the term:

14 (1) "Ad valorem taxes for educational purposes" means all ad valorem taxes for
15 educational purposes levied by, for, or on behalf of the Bartow County school district,

including, but not limited to, any ad valorem taxes to pay interest on and to retire countyschool district bonded indebtedness.

18 (2) "Homestead" means homestead as defined and qualified in Code Section 48-5-40 of
19 the O.C.G.A., as amended.

(b) Each resident of the Bartow County school district who is at least 65 years of age but
not yet 75 years of age on January 1 of the year in which application for the exemption is
made is granted an exemption on that person's homestead from Bartow County school
district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$60,000.00 of the
assessed value of that homestead. The value of that property in excess of such exempted
amount shall remain subject to taxation.

(c) Each resident of the Bartow County school district who is at least 75 years of age but
not yet 80 years of age on January 1 of the year in which application for the exemption is
made is granted an exemption on that person's homestead from Bartow County school
district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$80,000.00 of the
assessed value of that homestead. The value of that property in excess of such exempted
amount shall remain subject to taxation.

(d) Each resident of the Bartow County school district who is at least 80 years of age or
older on January 1 of the year in which application for the exemption is made is granted
an exemption on that person's homestead from Bartow County school district ad valorem
taxes for educational purposes in the amount of the full assessed value of that homestead
that does not exceed \$500,000.00 appraised fair market value. The value of that property
in excess of such exempted amount shall remain subject to taxation.

(e) A person shall not receive the homestead exemption granted by subsection (b), (c),
or (d) of this section unless all ad valorem taxes assessed on the property have been paid
in full for the preceding five years and such person or person's agent files an application
with the tax commissioner of Bartow County, giving the person's age and such additional
information relative to receiving such exemption as will enable the tax commissioner of

Bartow County to make a determination regarding the initial and continuing eligibility of
such person for such exemption. The tax commissioner of Bartow County shall provide
application forms for this purpose.

46 (f) The exemption shall be claimed and returned as provided in Code Section 48-5-50.1 47 of the O.C.G.A., as amended. The exemption shall be automatically renewed from year 48 to year as long as the person granted the homestead exemption under subsection (b), (c), 49 or (d) of this section occupies the residence as a homestead. After a person has filed the 50 proper application as provided in subsection (e) of this section, it shall not be necessary to 51 make application thereafter for any year, and the exemption shall continue to be allowed 52 to such person. It shall be the duty of any person granted the homestead exemption under 53 subsection (b), (c), or (d) of this section to notify the tax commissioner of Bartow County 54 in the event that person for any reason becomes ineligible for that exemption.

(g) The exemption granted by subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this section shall not apply to or affect any state ad valorem taxes, county ad valorem taxes for county purposes, municipal ad valorem taxes for municipal purposes, or independent school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes. The homestead exemption granted by subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this section shall be in lieu of any other homestead exemption applicable to Bartow County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes.

(h) The exemption granted by subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this section shall apply to all
taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2023 and ending on or before December 31,
2028.

SECTION 2.

In accordance with the requirements of Article VII, Section II, Paragraph II(a)(1) of the Constitution of the State of Georgia, this Act shall not become law unless it receives the requisite two-thirds' majority vote in both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

SECTION 3.

70 The election superintendent of Bartow County shall call and conduct an election as provided 71 in this section for the purpose of submitting this Act to the electors of the Bartow County 72 school district for approval or rejection. The election superintendent shall conduct that 73 election on any permissible special election date under Code Section 21-25-40 of the 74 O.C.G.A., but not later than the November, 2022, general election and shall issue the call and 75 conduct such election as provided by general law. The election superintendent shall cause 76 the date and purpose of the election to be published once a week for two weeks immediately 77 preceding the date thereof in the official organ of Bartow County. The ballot shall have 78 written or printed thereon the words:

79 "() YES Shall the Act be approved which provides a homestead exemption from 80 () NO Bartow County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in 81 the amount of \$60,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for 82 residents of that school district who are at least 65 years of age, in the 83 amount of \$80,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for residents 84 of that school district who are at least 75 years of age, and in the amount of 85 the full assessed value of the homestead that does not exceed \$500,000.00 86 appraised fair market value for residents of that school district who are at 87 least 80 years of age?"

All persons desiring to vote for approval of the Act shall vote "Yes," and all persons desiring to vote for rejection of the Act shall vote "No." If more than one-half of the votes cast on such question are for approval of the Act, Section 1 of this Act shall become of full force and effect on January 1, 2023. If the Act is not so approved or if the election is not conducted as provided in this section, Section 1 of this Act shall not become effective, and this Act shall be automatically repealed on the first day of January immediately following that election

- 95 date. The expense of such election shall be borne by Bartow County. It shall be the election
- 96 superintendent's duty to certify the result thereof to the Secretary of State.

97 SECTION 4. 98 Except as otherwise provided in Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall become effective upon

- 99 its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
