A PROCLAMATION

ALZHEIMER'S AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS:	Alzheimer's disease, the most common form of dementia, is a progressive and degenerative brain disorder that causes memory loss and affects self-care, decision making, and behavior; and
WHEREAS:	There are over 140,000 Georgians living with Alzheimer's disease, and there are currently hundreds of thousands of unpaid caregivers providing millions of hours of support to loved ones with Alzheimer's disease each year. Dementia is the sixth leading cause of death in Georgia and the only leading cause of death with no known treatments to prevent, cure, or even delay the onset or slow the progression of the disease; and
WHEREAS:	With early detection and diagnosis, individuals and families can gain access to medications and support services that promote quality of life, fully participate in planning for the future, and enroll in critical research trials; and
WHEREAS:	The Georgia State Plan to Address Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementias outlines the action steps that are being implemented by the Georgia Alzheimer's and Related Dementias (GARD) Task Force to promote brain health; address care planning; improve the quality of life for those living with dementia; provide evidence-based health care; ease the strain on family caregivers; and reduce associated costs in the future; and
WHEREAS:	It is important to recognize the stories, strengths, and efforts of the individuals, families, friends, and caregivers impacted by Alzheimer's disease, as well as the tireless work of the researchers who are seeking a cause and cure; now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 2023, as ALZHEIMER'S AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.
