A PROCLAMATION

ARTHROGRYPOSIS AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS:	Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita (AMC) is a medical condition that causes the joints to be stiff and crooked at birth; and
WHEREAS:	A newborn with Arthrogryposis lacks the normal range of motion in one or more joints. This prenatal condition can be caused by underlying and preexisting conditions; and
WHEREAS:	In order to be diagnosed with AMC, a newborn must have three contracted joints in two different areas of the body; and
WHEREAS:	Joints with the potential to be affected by AMC include hands, feet, hips, knees, elbows, shoulders, wrists, fingers, and toes. Additionally, the jaw and spine can be affected; and
WHEREAS:	Although Arthrogryposis is not curable, it is treatable. Treatment goals intend to allow those living with the condition to have as much independence in their daily lives as possible; and
WHEREAS:	Increased awareness will improve the capacity for research of better treatments and access to care for arthrogryposis: now
THEREFORE:	I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 30 th , 2023, as ARTHROGRYPOSIS AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
