APROCLAMATION

ATAXIA AWARENESS DAY

WHEREAS: Ataxia is a degenerative disease of the nervous system that is typically caused by

damage to the part of the brain that is known as the cerebellum, but can also be

caused by damage to the spinal cord or other nerves; and

WHEREAS: Ataxia can either be acquired or hereditary. In the case of the latter, it can be

inherited by an autosomal recessive or autosomal dominant gene; and

WHEREAS: Symptoms vary by person and type of Ataxia but may include lack of

coordination, slurred speech, deterioration of motor skills, and difficulty

walking; and

WHEREAS: Ataxia does not have any approved treatment or cure, and can affect any

individual at any time without regard to age, sex, or race; and

WHEREAS: Ataxia Awareness Day provides an important opportunity to raise awareness of

Ataxia. The State of Georgia encourages all who are affected, either directly or

indirectly, to get involved in the ongoing search for a cure; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim

September 25, 2023, as ATAXIA AWARENESS DAY in Georgia.
