A PROCLAMATION

AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: Autism spectrum disorders are a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges

with social skills, repetitive behaviors, and speech and nonverbal communications; and

WHEREAS: Symptoms and characteristics of autism spectrum disorders may present themselves

in a variety of combinations and can result in significant lifelong difficulties in verbal

and nonverbal communication, social interaction, and leisure activities; and

WHEREAS: An autism spectrum disorder has wide-ranging implications for the entire family of the

diagnosed individual. Early diagnosis, research training, education, and therapy are

vital to reducing the negative effects of the disorder; and

WHEREAS: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that about 1 in 54 children

have been identified with autism spectrum disorder; and

WHEREAS: Autism spectrum disorders are often accompanied by medical conditions that impact

> quality of life, and though autism itself does not affect life expectancy, research has shown that the mortality rate among individuals with autism is twice as high as the

general population; and

WHEREAS: The State of Georgia recognizes the achievements in this field, and by promoting

increasing awareness seeks to better the care, services, and opportunities for individuals affected by autism so that they may achieve their greatest potential; now

THEREFORE: I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April

2023, as AUTISM AWARENESS MONTH in Georgia.

In witness thereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Executive Department to be affixed this 20th day of February in the year of our Lord, Two Thousand and Twenty-Three.
